DELIVERING safety where you live

→ Mount Gravatt police facility upgrade

Commencing the upgrade of the Mount Gravatt police facility, an investment of \$30 million.

→ Early Intervention and Rehabilitation

\$560 million for comprehensive early intervention and rehabilitation programs across Queensland to reduce youth offending and reduce the number of victims.



DELIVERING health services when you need them

→ Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Hospital Expansion

\$621 million for a building with 112 new beds to deliver additional capacity, acute care and support services as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

→ More health workers

More health workers for Brisbane South, with additional funding in 2025–26 to grow the workforce to 44,216 (FTE) across the Metro North, Metro South and Children's Health Queensland Hospital and Health Services.

→ More social and community housing

\$43.8 million to expand and improve social and community housing in Brisbane South, with 93 social homes in construction or under contract towards the delivery of 53,500 social and community homes by 2044, including in partnership with the Australian Government.

→ Prebble Street bikeway

Delivering the new Prebble Street bikeway, servicing the communities of Rochedale and Wishart.

→ MacGregor State High School

\$200,000 to deliver tennis facility upgrades.

→ 2032 Delivery Plan – Queensland Tennis Centre

Delivering major legacy infrastructure with the expansion of Queensland Tennis Centre, as part of the 2032 Delivery Plan.

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Safety where you live



Mount Gravatt police facility upgrade

Commencing the upgrade of the Mount Gravatt police facility, an investment of \$30 million.

Early Intervention and Rehabilitation

\$560 million for comprehensive early intervention and rehabilitation programs across Queensland to reduce youth offending and reduce the number of victims.

Increase capacity - Arthur Gorrie Correctional Centre

Increase capacity at the Arthur Gorrie Correctional Centre.

Oxley Relocation Business Case Project

\$50 million to upgrade and relocate functions of the Oxley Police Academy.

Making Queensland Safer laws rollout

Delivering additional justice system resourcing in Brisbane to support the implementation of *Making Queensland Safer* laws.

Additional POLAIR flight hours in South East Queensland

\$4 million to provide additional flight hours for POLAIR capability in South East Queensland, including in Brisbane South.

Enhancing the Victim Liaison Service at the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions

\$11.6 million over 4 years to enhance the support provided to victims of crime across the state by the Victim Liaison Service.

Secure Communities Partnership Program

\$40 million to provide grants to small businesses and local governments across the state, to implement measures to improve community safety and prevent crime in public commercial and business precincts.

Victims Advocate Service

\$50 million to deliver a new professional Victims Advocate Service to provide dedicated support to victims of crime across the state, through the justice process.

Daniel's Law

\$10 million across the state to deliver a public child sex offender register to keep Queensland children safe.

Domestic and Family Violence Prevention

\$25 million across the state to deliver an electronic monitoring (GPS tracker) pilot of high risk domestic and family violence offenders.

Health services when you need them



Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Hospital car park

\$127.4 million for construction of a multi-storey carpark at the QEII Hospital, providing additional spaces, as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

More health workers

More health workers for Brisbane South, with additional funding in 2025–26 to grow the workforce to 44,216 (FTE) across the Metro North, Metro South and Children's Health Queensland Hospital and Health Services.

Princess Alexandra Hospital Expansion

\$761 million to construct a new acute service building above the existing emergency department with 249 new beds, as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

Princess Alexandra Hospital T4 Tunnel remediation works

\$45.1 million to review T4 Tunnel condition and undertake remediation works investigation, as part of the newly uplifted Timely Investment Infrastructure Maintenance Program.

Queensland Children's Hospital emergency and exit lighting

\$10.7 million to update the emergency and exit lighting in the Hospital Precinct, as part of the newly uplifted Timely Investment Infrastructure Maintenance Program.

Princess Alexandra Hospital car park

Additional car parking spaces will be constructed for patients, carers, visitors and staff at the Princess Alexandra Hospital as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Hospital Expansion

\$621 million for a building with 112 new beds to deliver additional capacity, acute care and support services as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

Cooper Plains Forensic and Scientific Services temporary mortuary

\$10.2 million to construct a modular temporary mortuary expanding site capacity, as part of the newly uplifted Timely Investment Infrastructure Maintenance Program.

Reducing ambulance ramping

Health services when you need them with more paramedics and initiatives to reduce ambulance ramping below 30 per cent by 2028.

Surgery Waitlist Stabilisation

\$1.8 billion to deliver more elective surgeries when and where Queenslanders need them including partnering with the private sector through the Surgery Connect Program to reduce waitlists and have patients seen sooner.

\$600,000 in 2025–26 to upgrade Lovewell Café, as part of the Social Entrepreneurs Fund.

Frontline housing and homelessness services

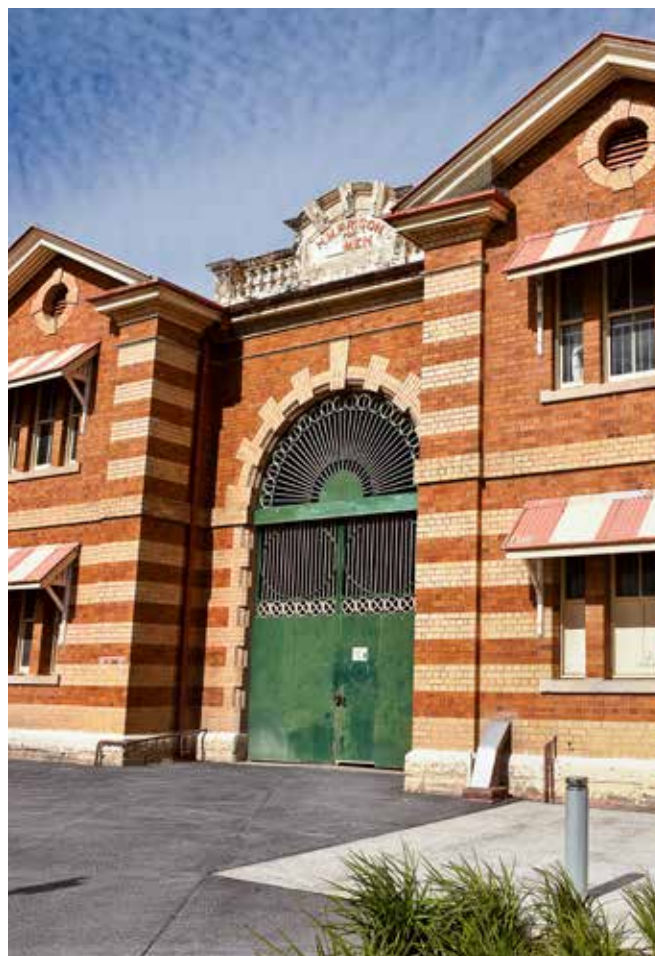
Delivering housing and homelessness services to vulnerable Queenslanders across the Brisbane South region to assist them to secure long-term housing and access other specialist support services including temporary accommodation, outreach and connection to broader community services. This is provided through funding and partnerships with Specialist Homelessness Services.

Fire Ant Suppression Taskforce

\$24 million to continue the joint taskforce to oversee fire ant suppression activities, including in Brisbane South, by local governments, industry and Queensland Government.

Mount Gravatt Men's Shed - improvement project

\$2 million for the Mount Gravatt Men's Shed improvement project.



Fire Systems for Brisbane Recovery Centres

\$1.6 million to install automated fire detection and suppression systems at 4 resource recovery centres to enhance safety and reduce fire risk.

Rocklea - depot and training facility redevelopment

\$41.3 million to redevelop the depot and training facilities at Rocklea to facilitate continued growth in apprentices in the energy sector.

Locking In 50c Fares

Delivering long-term cost of living relief for commuters by making 50c fares permanent.

Boost to Buy to reduce the deposit gap

Reducing the deposit gap for 1,000 Queenslanders across the state who don't have savings to get into their first home.

Back to School Boost

Delivering cost of living relief with \$100 for every Queensland primary school child across the state, to support families with the cost of school essentials.

Play On!

More affordable and accessible sport for all Queensland kids with \$200 *Play On!* voucher program to help reduce the cost of participation in the biggest investment ever.

Abolishing taxes for first home buyers

Delivering cost of living relief by abolishing stamp duty on all new homes across the state for first home buyers.

First Home Owner Grant Boost extension

Delivering cost of living relief for first home buyers across the state by extending the First Home Owner Grant to \$30,000 for 12 months.

\$75,000 to refurbish the outdated kitchen at the Mount Gravatt Girl Guides.

Wishart State School

\$4.4 million to deliver a multipurpose court and ramp.

Stretton State College

\$11 million to extend the existing multipurpose hall.

Western Suburbs State Special School

\$33.3 million to deliver a new administration and learning centre.

Kuraby State School

\$131,000 for school playground and tuckshop upgrades.

Seville Road State School

\$116,000 for school playground and tuckshop upgrades.

Games On! Souths Rugby Union Club

\$1 million to finish upgrades to the clubhouse and facilities, as part of the \$250 million *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Games On! Souths Sunnybank Rugby League Football Club

\$180,000 for field returfing, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Third Place Group

\$100,000 for Moorooka Clubhouse to upgrade the outdoor facilities to provide shade to the grass area.

Games On! Souths Acacia Ridge Rugby League Football Club

\$200,000 to deliver a lighting upgrade at the Mortimer Road facility, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Zero Litter to the Bay by 2030

\$35 million to partner with local government to upgrade stormwater network infrastructure and prevent litter escaping into Moreton Bay by 2030.

2032 Delivery Plan

Putting the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games back on track with a plan to deliver what's needed for Queensland's future, with transport and infrastructure, tourism and grassroots sporting facilities across the state.

Fixing the Bruce

\$9 billion to deliver improvements to the Bruce Highway across multiple regions, delivered in 80:20 partnership with the Australian Government.

Destination 2045

\$446 million to support Destination 2045: Delivering Queensland's Tourism Future including funding for aviation attraction, event attraction and new product development across the state.

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
