→ Ferny Grove police facility upgrade

Commencing the upgrade of the Ferny Grove police facility, total investment of \$7 million.

→ Early Intervention and Rehabilitation

\$560 million for comprehensive early intervention and rehabilitation programs across Queensland to reduce youth offending and reduce the number of victims.

→ More health workers

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Safety where you live



Ferny Grove police facility upgrade

Commencing the upgrade of the Ferny Grove police facility, total investment of \$7 million.

Early Intervention and Rehabilitation

\$560 million for comprehensive early intervention and rehabilitation programs across Queensland to reduce youth offending and reduce the number of victims.

Additional POLAIR flight hours in South East Queensland

\$4 million to provide additional flight hours for POLAIR capability in South East Queensland, including in Brisbane West.

Enhancing the Victim Liaison Service at the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions

\$11.6 million over 4 years to enhance the support provided to victims of crime across the state by the Victim Liaison Service.

Making Queensland Safer laws rollout

\$6 million over 4 years to provide additional justice system resourcing in Brisbane to support the implementation of *Making Queensland Safer* laws.

Secure Communities Partnership Program

\$40 million statewide to provide grants to small businesses and local governments across the state, to implement measures to improve community safety and prevent crime in public commercial and business precincts.

Victims Advocate Service

\$50 million to deliver a new professional Victims Advocate Service to provide dedicated support to victims of crime across the state, through the justice process.

Daniel's Law

\$10 million across the state to deliver a public child sex offender register to keep Queensland children safe.

Domestic and Family Violence Prevention

\$25 million across the state to deliver an electronic monitoring (GPS tracker) pilot of high risk domestic and family violence offenders.

Health services when you need them



More health workers

More health workers for Brisbane West, with additional funding in 2025-26 to grow the workforce to 44,216 (FTE) across the Metro North, Metro South and Children's Health Queensland Hospital and Health Services.

Surgery Waitlist Stabilisation

\$1.8 billion to deliver more elective surgeries when and where Queenslanders need them including partnering with the private sector through the Surgery Connect Program to reduce waitlists and have patients seen sooner.

Hospital Rescue Plan

Delivering more than 2,600 extra beds across the state including 3 new hospitals and 10 hospital expansions and more regional health services.

Reducing ambulance ramping

Health services when you need them with more paramedics and initiatives to reduce ambulance ramping below 30 per cent by 2028.

Real-time health data

Delivering the government's new Open Hospitals website to share data in real time and drive cultural change across the state.

Improving patient flow

\$581 million to stabilise bed capacity to improve patient flow across the state, with 515 beds across the Queensland Health system.

Midwife to patient ratios

\$48.7 million to deliver the legislated but previously unfunded midwife to patient ratios across the state.

A better lifestyle through a stronger economy



Frontline Housing and Homelessness Services

Delivering housing and homelessness services to vulnerable Queenslanders to assist them to secure long-term housing and access other specialist support services including temporary accommodation, outreach and connection to broader community services. This is provided through funding and partnerships with Specialist Homelessness Services.

Moggill Community and Neighbourhood Centre

Delivering a dedicated community and neighbourhood centre for Moggill.

More social and community housing

\$5.4 million to expand and improve social and community housing within the Brisbane West region, working towards the delivery of 53,500 social and community homes by 2044.

Fire Ant Suppression Taskforce

\$24 million to continue the joint taskforce to oversee fire ant suppression activities, including in Brisbane West, by local governments, industry and Queensland Government.

Upper Kedron - Minnie Street upgrade

\$3.9 million to upgrade Upper Kedron's Minnie Street for improved safety, capacity, pedestrian, cyclist and traffic access.

Mount Crosby East Substation

\$25.2 million to establish the new Mount Crosby East Substation, replacing Mount Crosby Substation.

Boost to Buy to reduce the deposit gap

Reducing the deposit gap for 1,000 Queenslanders across the state who don't have savings to get into their first home.

Back to School Boost

Delivering cost of living relief with \$100 for every Queensland primary school child across the state to help cover the cost of school essentials every year.

Locking In 50c Fares

Delivering long-term cost of living relief for commuters by making 50c fares permanent.



Play On!

More affordable and accessible sport for all Queensland kids with \$200 Play On! voucher program to help reduce the cost of participation in the biggest investment ever.

Abolishing taxes for first home buyers

Delivering cost of living relief by abolishing stamp duty on all new homes across the state for first home buyers.

First Home Owner Grant Boost extension

Delivering cost of living relief for first home buyers across the state by extending the First Home Owner Grant to \$30,000 for 12 months.

One Million Homes by 2044

As part of the Securing Our Housing Foundations plan, the government will deliver one million homes across Queensland by 2044.

Environmental Conservation

Centenary Bridge Upgrade

Delivering the Centenary Bridge duplication to get Western Brisbane residents home sooner.

Planning for new high school for Brisbane's Western Suburbs

Funding a business case to deliver a new high school for the western suburbs of Brisbane, as part of the \$70.68 million School and Education Boost funding.

Indooroopilly State School

\$32.5 million to deliver additional learning spaces and administration upgrade.

Oakleigh State School

\$325,000 in 2025–26 to deliver a prep outdoor learning area.

Western Suburbs Road and Transport Plan

Delivering an integrated Road and Public Transport Plan for the western suburbs of Brisbane to better connect a growing area.

Moggill Mustangs Junior AFL Club

Delivering facility upgrades, including changeroom facilities for Moggill Mustangs' Junior AFL Club.

Games On! Centenary Stormers Football Club

Delivering lighting upgrades at Centenary Stormers Football Club, as part of the \$250 million *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Kenmore Scout Group

\$50,000 to enable vital infrastructure refurbishments and upgrades.

University of Queensland Football Club

\$75,000 for field and lighting upgrades.

Games On! Honeyeater Park

\$1.5 million towards the Honeyeater Park Sports Precinct to deliver a new playing field and connected facilities, in partnership with Brisbane City Council, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Moggill Girl Guides

\$50,000 to support capital and infrastructure upgrades, and to refurbish amenities.

Zero Litter to the Bay by 2030

\$35 million to partner with local government to upgrade stormwater network infrastructure and prevent litter escaping into Moreton Bay by 2030.

2032 Delivery Plan

Putting the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games back on track with a plan to deliver what's needed for Queensland's future, with transport and infrastructure, tourism and grassroots sporting facilities across the state.



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
