→ Anti-hooning measures

Delivering \$2 million for a network of anti-hooning cameras to be delivered across Rochedale South, Springwood, Daisy Hill, Shailer Park, Mount Cotton, Sheldon and Priestdale.

→ More health workers

More health workers for Logan, with additional funding in 2025–26 to grow the workforce to 17,779 (FTE) across Metro South Hospital and Health Service.

→ Logan Hospital expansion (Stage 2)

\$874.7 million to deliver a clinical services building with 112 new beds for additional surgical capacity, acute care and support services as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.



DELIVERING a better lifestyle through a stronger economy

→ More social and community housing

\$52.1 million to expand and improve social and community housing in Logan, with 172 social homes in construction or under contract towards the delivery of 53,500 social and community homes by 2044, in partnership with the Australian Government.

→ Logan and Gold Coast Faster Rail

Getting on with the job of unlocking faster rail and additional train services to and from the Gold Coast.



DELIVERING a plan for Queensland's future

→ Mount Lindesay Highway upgrades

\$7 million towards planning for safety and capacity upgrades to the Mount Lindesay Highway between Jimboomba and Beaudesert.

→ Games On! Cornubia Park Sporting Precinct

\$5.6 million for upgrades to the Cornubia Park Sporting Precinct, as part of the Games On! Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Anti-hooning measures

Delivering \$2 million for a network of anti-hooning cameras to be delivered across Rochedale South, Springwood, Daisy Hill, Shailer Park, Mount Cotton, Sheldon and Priestdale.

Additional POLAIR flight hours in South East Queensland

\$4 million to provide additional flight hours for POLAIR capability in South East Queensland, including in Logan.

Enhancing the Victim Liaison Service at the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions

\$11.6 million over 4 years to enhance the support provided to victims of crime across the state by the Victim Liaison Service.

Courthouse infrastructure – strategic land acquisition – Beenleigh

\$10 million for strategic land acquisition to enable future replacement of the Beenleigh courthouse.

Brisbane Supreme and District Court capacity expansion

\$38 million to expand capacity of the Brisbane Supreme and District Court to help ease demand pressures at the Beenleigh courthouse.

Logan police facility upgrade

\$76 million to upgrade the Logan police facility.

Youth Justice Schools

\$40 million to establish 2 Youth Justice Schools for high-risk teens on Youth Justice orders including community service orders.

Early Intervention and Rehabilitation

\$560 million for comprehensive early intervention and rehabilitation programs across the state, to reduce youth offending and reduce the number of victims.

Secure Communities Partnership Program

\$40 million to provide grants to small businesses and local governments across the state, to implement measures to improve community safety and prevent crime in public commercial and business precincts.

Health services when you need them



More health workers

More health workers for Logan, with additional funding in 2025–26 to grow the workforce to 17,779 (FTE) across Metro South Hospital and Health Service.

Logan Hospital expansion (Stage 1)

\$440.8 million to deliver additional beds and bed alternatives with targeted refurbishment of key locations.

Logan Hospital expansion (Stage 2)

\$874.7 million to deliver a clinical services building with 112 new beds for additional surgical capacity, acute care and support services as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

Beenleigh Central Ambulance Station

\$16.5 million to build the new Beenleigh Central Ambulance Station.

Logan Hospital car park

Additional car parking spaces will be constructed for patients, carers, visitors and staff at the Logan Hospital, as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

Springwood Station replacement

\$8.1 million to deliver a 24/7 operational ambulance service facility. The construction will include a replacement modern ambulance station with office.

Hospital Rescue Plan

Delivering more than 2,600 extra beds across the state including 3 new hospitals and 10 hospital expansions and more regional health services.

Reducing ambulance ramping

Health services when you need them with more paramedics and initiatives to reduce ambulance ramping below 30 per cent by 2028.

Surgery Waitlist Stabilisation

\$1.8 billion to deliver more elective surgeries when and where Queenslanders need them including partnering with the private sector through the Surgery Connect Program to reduce waitlists and have patients seen sooner.

Fire Ant Suppression Taskforce

\$24 million to continue the joint taskforce to oversee fire ant suppression activities, including in Logan, by local governments, industry and the Queensland Government.

Phoenix Ensemble Inc.

\$90,000 upgrade with structural floor improvements, brand new seating and fresh carpeting.

Logan East Community Neighbourhood Centre – Community Connect

\$450,000 to Logan East Community Neighbourhood Centre to support their Community Connect Program.

Pavement rehabilitation on Magnesium Drive, Crestmead

\$2.3 million to undertake pavement rehabilitation and resurfacing works on Magnesium Drive in Crestmead to improve road condition and longevity.

Frontline housing and homelessness services

Delivering housing and homelessness services to vulnerable Queenslanders across the Logan region to assist them to secure long-term housing and access other specialist support services including temporary accommodation, outreach and connection to broader community services. This is provided through funding and partnerships with Specialist Homelessness Services.

Underwood Park car park upgrades

\$2 million to upgrade the car park at Underwood Park.

Boost to Buy to reduce the deposit gap

Reduce the deposit gap for 1,000 Queenslanders across the state who don't have savings to get into their first home.

Back to School Boost

Delivering cost of living relief with \$100 for every Queensland primary school child across the state to help cover the cost of school essentials every year.



Play On!

More affordable and accessible sport for all Queensland kids with \$200 Play On! voucher program to help reduce the cost of participation in the biggest investment ever.

Abolishing taxes for first home buyers

Delivering cost of living relief by abolishing stamp duty on all new homes across the state for first home buyers.

First Home Owner Grant Boost extension

Delivering cost of living relief for first home buyers across the state by extending the First Home Owner Grant to \$30,000 for 12 months.

One Million Homes by 2044

As part of the Securing Our Housing Foundations plan, the government will deliver one million homes across Queensland by 2044.

Residential Activation Fund

\$2 billion to boost the construction of essential housing infrastructure such as water supply, sewerage, stormwater, power supply and roads to unlock land for new homes across the state.

\$7 million towards planning for safety and capacity upgrades to the Mount Lindesay Highway between Jimboomba and Beaudesert.

Games On! Cornubia Park Sporting Precinct

\$5.6 million for upgrades to the Cornubia Park Sporting Precinct, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Games On! Slacks Creek RLFC

\$300,000 to upgrade the Slacks Creek Rugby League Football Club field, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Greater Flagstone PDA

\$16.1 million to deliver key road projects within the Greater Flagstone Priority Development Area which will support land supply.

New special school in Beenleigh

Delivering a new special school in Beenleigh to relieve local special schools, as part of an \$815 million new schools commitment.

New special school in central Logan

Delivering a new special school in Logan to relieve local special schools, part of an \$815 million new schools commitment.

Shailer Park State High School

Delivering a new multipurpose hall, as part of the \$70.68 million School and Education Boost funding.

2032 Delivery Plan

Putting the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games back on track with a plan to deliver what's needed for Queensland's future, with transport and infrastructure, tourism and grassroots sporting facilities across the state.

Destination 2045

\$446 million to support Destination 2045: Delivering Queensland's Tourism Future including funding for aviation attraction, event attraction and new product development across the state.

Fully funding state schools

Delivering a record investment into Queensland's education system to fully fund state schools across the state for the first time in Queensland, in partnership with Australian Government.

Games On! Grassroots Infrastructure Program

\$250 million for a community Olympic and Paralympic legacy fund to boost participation in grassroots sport across the state in the lead up to the Games.

More teacher aides and support teachers

Delivering 550 more teacher aides and support teachers across the state to help boost educational outcomes.

More time in the classroom

Reducing red tape for teachers by 25 per cent across the state to free up more time for planning lessons.



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
