\$1.4 million for the replacement of the rural fire brigade station at Delaneys Creek.

Making Queensland Safer laws rollout

Restoring safety where you live with strong laws and consequences for actions across the state.

Early Intervention and Rehabilitation

\$560 million for comprehensive early intervention and rehabilitation programs across the state, to reduce youth offending and reduce the number of victims.

Secure Communities Partnership Program

\$40 million to provide grants to small businesses and local governments across the state, to implement measures to improve community safety and prevent crime in public commercial and business precincts.

Victims Advocate Service

\$50 million to deliver a new professional Victims Advocate Service to provide dedicated support to victims of crime across the state, through the justice process.

Health services when you need them



Redcliffe Hospital expansion

The Redcliffe Hospital will be expanded with at least 210 new overnight beds, as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

More health workers

More health workers for Moreton Bay, with additional funding in 2025–26 to grow the workforce to 21,681 (FTE) across Metro North Hospital and Health Service.

Redcliffe Hospital car park (Stage 1)

Additional car parking spaces will be constructed for patients, carers, visitors and staff at the Redcliffe Hospital, as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

Caboolture Hospital – Mental Health Intensive Care Unit

Deliver additional high dependency mental health beds, seclusion room and external courtyard at Caboolture Hospital.

Caboolture Hospital – Paediatric Outpatients area build

\$15 million to build a dedicated Paediatric Outpatients area at Caboolture Hospital.

Caboolture Hospital Redevelopment (Stage 1)

\$367.7 million to redevelop the Caboolture Hospital to support an additional 130 beds and refurbishment of critical clinical support services.

Hospital Rescue Plan

Delivering more than 2,600 extra beds across the state including 3 new hospitals and 10 hospital expansions and more regional health services.

Reducing ambulance ramping

Health services when you need them with more paramedics and initiatives to reduce ambulance ramping below 30 per cent by 2028.

Surgery Waitlist Stabilisation

\$1.8 billion to deliver more elective surgeries when and where Queenslanders need them including partnering with the private sector through the Surgery Connect Program to reduce waitlists and have patients seen sooner.

Real-time health data

Delivering the government's new Open Hospitals website to share data in real time and drive cultural change across the state.

More social and community housing

\$70.4 million to expand and improve social and community housing in Moreton Bay, with 256 social homes in construction or under contract towards the delivery of 53,500 social and community homes by 2044, including in partnership with the Australian Government.

Bribie Island Bridge

Delivering a new Bribie Island Bridge to provide better transport for Bribie Island residents.

On-Demand Bus Service

Delivering an on-demand bus service trial for Bribie Island to connect residents with important local services

D'Aguilar Highway intersection upgrades

Upgrades to dangerous intersections on the D'Aguilar Highway – George Street, Raaen Road, Mount Mee Road and Campbells Pocket Road.

Moreton Bay Meals on Wheels

\$300,000 of additional funding for Moreton Bay Meals on Wheels to support their invaluable work in the community.

University of the 3rd Age (U3A) - Bribie Island

\$100,000 to help University of the 3rd Age (U3A) Bribie Island secure a new home.

Dickson Men's Shed and Stationery Aid

\$3.1 million to build new facilities for the Dickson Men's Shed and Stationery Aid at James Drysdale Reserve at Bunya.

Bribie Island Neighbourhood Centre

\$4.7 million total spend to complete the redevelopment of Bribie Island Neighbourhood Centre.

Albany Creek Library Courtyard Upgrade

\$600,000 total spend to upgrade the outdoor courtyard at the Albany Creek Library.

Clayton Park Playground, Beachmere

\$500,000 to upgrade the playground at Clayton Park, Beachmere.



Energex – Build New Petrie substation

\$21.6 million total spend to establish new Petrie Substation, reinforcing grid stability.

Boost to Buy to reduce the deposit gap

Reducing the deposit gap for 1,000 Queenslanders across the state who don't have savings to get into their first home.

Back to School Boost

Delivering cost of living relief with \$100 for every Queensland primary school child across the state to help cover the cost of school essentials every year.

Play On!

More affordable and accessible sport for all Queensland kids with \$200 *Play On!* voucher program to help reduce the cost of participation in the biggest investment ever.

A plan for Queensland's future



Moreton Bay Wildlife Hospital and Education Hub

\$15 million for the Moreton Bay Wildlife Hospital and Education Hub in Dakabin to protect Queensland's precious wildlife.

New special school in Moreton Bay South

Delivering a new special school to relieve local special schools, as part of an \$815 million new schools commitment.

Woodford State School

Delivering accommodation for Years 11 and 12, as part of the \$70.68 million School and Education Boost funding.

Redcliffe Area Youth Space Program

\$2 million to build a specialist program in partnership with City of Moreton Bay to support young people disengaged, or at risk of disengaging from education.

Zero Litter to the Bay by 2030

\$35 million to partner with local government to upgrade stormwater network infrastructure and prevent litter escaping into Moreton Bay by 2030.

PCYC Pine Rivers

\$2.1 million towards the Pine Rivers PCYC upgrade that will offer youth development programs, sport, recreation and community run activities.

Moreton Bay TAFE Centre of Excellence

\$60 million for the new Moreton Bay TAFE Centre of Excellence.

Games On! Bribie Island Netball Club

\$170,500 to resurface the netball courts at the Bribie Island Netball Club, as part of the \$250 million *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Games On! Beachmere Rugby League

\$153,000 for lighting upgrades at the Beachmere Sports Club Complex, as part of the \$250 million *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Games On! Redcliffe Tigers AFL Club

\$200,000 to design female change rooms for the Redcliffe Tigers, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Eatons Hill State School

\$500,000 for the drop-off pick-up area and car park.

Pine Rivers State High School

\$9.6 million to deliver additional specialist classrooms.

Redcliffe and District Woodcrafters Society

\$33,000 to upgrade the electric Wood-Mizer at Redcliffe and District Woodcrafters Society.

Bribie Island Movement and Strength Club

\$920,000 to expand the Bribie Island Strength and Movement Club.

Dayboro Scout Group

\$500,000 for Dayboro Scouts' Hall to restore internal and external woodwork and paint.
