#### → Additional CCTV for Redlands

#### → More health workers

#### → Southern Moreton Bay Islands Barge Subsidy

Providing parking relief for Southern Moreton Bay Island residents through a 50 per cent subsidy on vehicle barge travel.

#### → More social and community housing

\$49.5 million to expand and improve social and community housing in Redlands, with 143 social homes in construction or under contract towards the delivery of 53,500 homes by 2044, including in partnership with the Australian Government.

#### → Russell Island Centre of Excellence

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## Safety where you live



### **Additional CCTV**

\$1.2 million to deliver fixed and mobile CCTV cameras in Cleveland and Capalaba to deter hooning, nuisance, and property and motor vehicle offences.

### ***Making Queensland Safer laws***

Adult Crime, Adult Time for young offenders across the state, who commit the most serious offences.

### **Anti-hooning measures**

Delivering \$2 million for a network of anti-hooning cameras to be delivered across Rochedale South, Springwood, Daisy Hill, Shailer Park, Mount Cotton, Sheldon and Priestdale.

### **Additional POLAIR flight hours in South East Queensland**

\$4 million to provide additional flight hours for POLAIR capability in South East Queensland, including in the Redlands.

### **Early Intervention and Rehabilitation**

\$560 million for comprehensive early intervention and rehabilitation programs across the state, to reduce youth offending and reduce the number of victims.

### **Secure Communities Partnership Program**

\$40 million to provide grants to small businesses and local governments across the state, to implement measures to improve community safety and prevent crime in public commercial and business precincts.

### **Victims Advocate Service**

\$50 million to deliver a new professional Victims Advocate Service to provide dedicated support to victims of crime across the state, through the justice process.

### **Daniel's Law**

\$10 million across the state to deliver a public child sex offender register to keep Queensland children safe.

### **Domestic and Family Violence Prevention**

\$25 million across the state to deliver an electronic monitoring (GPS tracker) pilot of high risk domestic and family violence offenders.

### **Safer Children, Safer Communities**

Stopping the youth crime pipeline across the state, being created by a broken child safety system, including a new secure care facility.

## Health services when you need them



### **More health workers**

More health workers for Redlands, with additional funding in 2025–26 to grow the workforce to 17,779 (FTE) across Metro South Hospital and Health Service.

### **Top Blokes Early Intervention**

\$75,000 for the Top Blokes mentorship and well-being programs at the YMCA Vocational School in Victoria Point.

### **Redland Hospital expansion (Stage 2)**

\$150 million to construct a new 43-bed Mental Health (20 new beds) and Allied Health building and relocate services from the current site as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan.

### **Hospital Rescue Plan**

Delivering more than 2,600 extra beds across the state including 3 new hospitals and 10 hospital expansions and more regional health services.

### **Reducing ambulance ramping**

Health services when you need them with more paramedics and initiatives to reduce ambulance ramping below 30 per cent by 2028.

### **Surgery Waitlist Stabilisation**

\$1.8 billion to deliver more elective surgeries when and where Queenslanders need them including partnering with the private sector through the Surgery Connect Program to reduce waitlists and have patients seen sooner.

### **Real-time health data**

Delivering the government's new Open Hospitals website to share data in real time and drive cultural change across the state.

### **Improving patient flow**

\$581 million to stabilise bed capacity to improve patient flow across the state, with 515 beds across the Queensland Health system.

### **Midwife to patient ratios**

\$48.7 million to deliver the legislated but previously unfunded midwife to patient ratios across the state.

## A better lifestyle through a stronger economy



### Southern Moreton Bay Islands Barge Subsidy

Providing parking relief for Southern Moreton Bay Island residents through a 50 per cent subsidy on vehicle barge travel.

### More social and community housing

\$49.5 million to expand and improve social and community housing, with 143 social homes in construction or under contract towards the delivery of 53,500 homes by 2044, including in partnership with the Australian Government.

### Frontline housing and homelessness services

Delivering housing and homelessness services to vulnerable Queenslanders in the Redlands to assist them to secure long-term housing and access other specialist support services including temporary accommodation, outreach and connection to broader community services. This is provided through funding and partnerships with specialist homelessness services.

### Fire Ant Suppression Taskforce

\$24 million to continue the joint taskforce to oversee fire ant suppression activities, including in Redlands, by local governments, industry and Queensland Government.

### Youth and community centre construction on Macleay Island

\$1 million to build a multi-purpose youth and community centre on Macleay Island to support local services and activities.

### Network Battery – Redlands

\$13.5 million to install a 4 Mega Watt/8 Mega Watt Hours capacity battery to store the excess solar PV generated by Cleveland's 3,000 solar customers.

### Boost to Buy to reduce the deposit gap

Reducing the deposit gap for 1,000 Queenslanders across the state who don't have savings to get into their first home.

### Back to School Boost

Delivering cost of living relief with \$100 for every Queensland primary school child across the state to help cover the cost of school essentials every year.



### Play On! vouchers

\$200 Play On! vouchers for Queensland children aged between 5 and 17 years across the state to participate in sport and active recreation, offering a broader reach in regional areas.

### Abolishing taxes for first home buyers

Delivering cost of living relief by abolishing stamp duty on all new homes across the state for first home buyers.

### First Home Owner Grant Boost extension

Delivering cost of living relief for first home buyers across the state by extending the First Home Owner Grant to \$30,000 for 12 months.

### One Million Homes by 2044

As part of the Securing Our Housing Foundations plan, the government will deliver one million homes across Queensland by 2044.

### Residential Activation Fund

\$2 billion to boost the construction of essential housing infrastructure such as water supply, sewerage, stormwater, power supply and roads to unlock land for new homes across the state.

## A plan for Queensland's future



### **Russell Island Centre of Excellence**

\$2 million to support a Marine Centre of Excellence for Southern Moreton Bay Islands in partnership with industry and TAFE Queensland.

### **Weinam Creek car park**

Delivering a new car park for commuters at Weinam Creek.

### **Wildlife Hospital – RSPCA Wildlife Hospital**

\$12 million for the RSPCA Wildlife Hospital, Redlands IndigiScapes Centre Precinct in Capalaba.

### **Games On! Redlands Cricket Club**

\$1 million to deliver new women's changeroom and bathroom block at the club's playing fields at EGW Wood Sportsground, as part of the \$250 million *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

### **Ormiston State School**

\$73,000 to deliver facility and musical instrument upgrades.

### **Redland District Special School**

Delivering additional learning spaces.

### **Birkdale South State School**

Delivering new amenities, as part of the \$70.68 million School and Education Boost funding.

### **Games On! Wellington Point Bowls Club**

\$1 million to install shade and synthetic surfaces, as part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

### **Zero Litter to the Bay by 2030**

\$35 million to partner with local government to upgrade stormwater network infrastructure and prevent litter escaping into Moreton Bay by 2030.

### **2032 Delivery Plan**

Putting the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games back on track with a plan to deliver what's needed for Queensland's future, with transport and infrastructure, tourism and grassroots sporting facilities across the state.

### **Destination 2045**

\$446 million to support Destination 2045: Delivering Queensland's Tourism Future including funding for aviation attraction, event attraction and new product development across the state.

### **Fully funding state schools**

Delivering a record investment into Queensland's education system to fully fund state schools across the state for the first time in Queensland, in partnership with Australian Government.



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
