Swan and Emu Creek Rural Fire Brigade Station

\$1 million to deliver the replacement of the rural fire brigade station at Swan and Emu Creek.

Warwick police facility upgrade

\$21 million for the upgrade of the police facility at Warwick.

Warwick's WillowTree 37

\$1 million for WillowTree 37 in Warwick to support vulnerable women in the Darling Downs.

Whetstone Rural Fire Brigade Station

\$700,000 for the replacement of the rural fire brigade station in Whetstone.

Warwick and Stanthorpe Safe City CCTV networks upgrades

\$300,000 to replace CCTV cameras and supporting infrastructure in the Warwick CBD and the Stanthorpe CBD. Part of the permanent Works for Queensland Program.

Making Queensland Safer laws rollout

Restoring safety where you live with strong laws and consequences for actions across the state.

Early Intervention and Rehabilitation

\$560 million for comprehensive early intervention and rehabilitation programs across the state, to reduce youth offending and reduce the number of victims.

Secure Communities Partnership Program

\$40 million to provide grants to small businesses and local governments across the state, to implement measures to improve community safety and prevent crime in public commercial and business precincts.

Victims Advocate Service

\$50 million to deliver a new professional Victims Advocate Service to provide dedicated support to victims of crime across the state, through the justice process.

Daniel's Law

\$10 million across the state to deliver a public child sex offender register to keep Queensland children safe.

Hospital Rescue Plan

Reducing ambulance ramping

Health services when you need them with more paramedics and initiatives to reduce ambulance ramping below 30 per cent by 2028.

Surgery Waitlist Stabilisation

\$1.8 billion to deliver more elective surgeries when and where Queenslanders need them including partnering with the private sector through the Surgery Connect Program to reduce waitlists and have patients seen sooner.

Real-time health data

Delivering the government's new Open Hospitals website to share data in real time and drive cultural change across the state.

Improving patient flow

\$581 million to stabilise bed capacity to improve patient flow across the state, with 515 beds across the Queensland Health system.

Midwife to patient ratios

\$48.7 million to deliver the legislated but previously unfunded midwife to patient ratios across the state.

Goondiwindi Neighbourhood Centre

Queensland College of Wine Tourism

Stepping in to save the wine college in Stanthorpe and protect more than 20 jobs in the region.

New social homes

Allora Community Precinct redevelopment

\$600,000 to remove the old Allora Fire Station, relocate the library and expand the Sports Museum to include a modern library and community meeting space. Part of the permanent Works for Queensland Program.

Goondiwindi road design improvements

\$60,000 to design improved pavement and drainage on Town Common Road, enhancing heavy vehicle access and flood resilience. Part of the permanent Works for Queensland Program.

Wild dog barrier fence renewal works – Goondiwindi region


\$1.1 million to replace 41 kilometres of wild dog barrier fence using durable dog netting and steel fittings across challenging terrain in the Goondiwindi region. Part of the permanent Works for Queensland Program.

Warwick Saleyards upgrades

\$795,000 to build fencing for holding paddocks, fit out a new sheep office, install a vegetation buffer, upgrade entrance signs and extend sheep fencing. Part of the permanent Works for Queensland Program.

Warwick Indoor Recreation and Aquatic Centre filtration system replacement

\$2 million to replace the Warwick Indoor Recreation and Aquatic Centre filtration system. Part of the permanent Works for Queensland Program.



Warwick Water Treatment Plant distribution centre upgrade

\$175,000 to replace sections of water mains and upgrade the distribution centre at Warwick Water Treatment Plant to improve network control and reliability. Part of the permanent Works for Queensland Program.

Boost to Buy to reduce the deposit gap

Reducing the deposit gap for 1,000 Queenslanders across the state who don't have savings to get into their first home.

Back to School Boost

Delivering cost of living relief with \$100 for every Queensland primary school child across the state to help cover the cost of school essentials every year.

Play On!

More affordable and accessible sport for all Queensland kids with \$200 *Play On!* voucher program to help reduce the cost of participation in the biggest investment ever.

Abolishing taxes for first home buyers
