Delivering additional justice system resourcing in Brisbane to support the implementation of Making Queensland Safer laws.

### **Queensland Fire and Rescue trucks**

Delivering new and replacement fire and rescue trucks to provide firefighters with the equipment needed to help protect the community (\$22.9 million in 2026-27).

### **Disaster Event System Replacement**

Delivering a replacement Disaster Event Management System to support more effective critical decision-making and responses during disaster events.

### **Keeping our kids safe**

Delivering a new A Block consisting of classrooms, amenities and support spaces.

### **Gumdale State School**

Delivering a new senior playground.

### **Mayfield State School**

Delivering a building extension to add a new performing arts classroom and ancillary spaces.

### **New special school in Wynnum Manly**

Delivering a new special school providing families more choice in their child's education.

### **More social and community housing**

Expanding and improving social and community housing across Brisbane's eastern suburbs, with 50 homes in construction or under contract, as the government progresses towards its target of 53,500 social and community homes by 2044.

### **Coorparoo Junior AFC**

Investing in building women's changerooms at Coorparoo Junior AFL Club. Part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

### **Easts Rugby Union**

Investing in new female changerooms at Easts Rugby Union. Part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

### **Holland Park Hawks Football Club**

Investing in upgrades at Holland Park Hawks Football Club. Part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

### **Chandler Sports Precinct**

Delivering precinct works to ensure the venues are accessible and fit for purpose for community and high-performance use in addition to supporting delivery of the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games. Part of the \$7.1 billion Games Venues Program jointly funded by the Queensland and Federal Governments.

### **Brisbane Aquatic Centre - Chandler**

Delivering upgrades to the aquatic centre to support events and community swimming as well as the delivery of the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

### **Brisbane SX International BMX Centre**

Delivering upgrades to the BMX racing centre to support events and community cycling participation and the delivery of the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

### **Anna Meares Velodrome**

Delivering upgrades to the velodrome to support cycling events, elite and community training and the delivery of the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

### **Brisbane International Shooting Centre**

Delivering upgrades to the shooting centre to support events, competition and community sport as well as the delivery of the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

### **Shafston Avenue Bikeway**

Delivering a new bikeway connection between Mowbray Park and the Deakin Street underpass to improve connections between the eastern suburbs and the CBD via the Kangaroo Point Bridge. Delivered in partnership with the Brisbane City Council.

## Better Services through a Stronger Economy



### Investing in the Ampol Lytton Refinery

Boosting Queensland's fuel security and sovereign capability through streamlined approvals and a \$25 million investment from the Sovereign Industry Development Fund to support the production of renewable diesel at Ampol's Lytton refinery.

### Wynnum Community Place

Delivering funding to expand the operations of Wynnum Community Place's Neighbourhood Centre over two years. Includes the delivery of groups and activities to improve social connection and inclusion.

### Protection of koala habitats in South East Queensland

Supporting koala habitat revegetation and landscape connectivity enhancement projects through the Grassroots Environmental Grants Koala Habitat Restoration program.

### Funding for B4C conservation project

Supporting the B4C Bulimba Creek Catchment Co-ordinating Committee to enhance local biodiversity and community stewardship with \$135,000 to support weed control and rehabilitation across the Bulimba Creek Catchment.

### Zero Litter to the Bay by 2030

Progressing partnerships with local government to upgrade stormwater network infrastructure by installing at least 100 filtration devices to prevent plastics and litter larger than 5mm escaping into Moreton Bay by 2030 (\$35 million over five years).

### Frontline housing and homelessness services

Delivering housing and homelessness services to vulnerable Queenslanders across Brisbane's eastern suburbs to assist them to secure longer-term housing and access other specialist support services including temporary accommodation, outreach and connection to broader community services.

### Freezing South East Queensland bulk water prices

Easing cost pressures on South East Queensland households by freezing bulk water prices for two years, saving families around \$130.

### Minnippi Bikeway missing link in Carina

Constructing missing shared path connection at Minnippi Parklands, Carina. Part of the South East Queensland Community Stimulus Program.

### Skilling Queenslanders for Work

Delivering employment and training programs in Brisbane East to assist unemployed and underemployed Queenslanders into work. Part of the annual \$80 million Skilling Queenslanders for Work investment.

### Wellspring Women and Girls Hub Hawthorne

Delivering the Wellspring Women and Girls Hub Hawthorne to provide women and girls access to health care and support, including a mix of medical, nursing, counselling and social services.

### Supercharged Solar for Renters

Driving down renters' power bills for more than 6,500 households with solar rebates, saving around \$700 a year. Eligible landlords can receive a rebate of up to \$3,500 to install solar on rental properties.
