Helping protect victims of domestic and family violence with an electronic monitoring pilot program for high-risk domestic and family violence offenders.

Fixing the DNA Debacle

Continuing to deliver faster justice for victims by clearing the backlog at the DNA Lab and bolstering Director of Public Prosecutions resources to get cases to court quicker.





Land Activation Program

Delivering new homes through the Land Activation Program to unlock surplus and under-utilised government land, including 450 new homes on the former Energex site in Banyo.

Northshore Hamilton

Delivering urban renewal development at Northshore Hamilton including supporting civil and precinct infrastructure.

Newmarket State School

Delivering a new building to provide additional classrooms.

More social and community housing

Expanding and improving social and community housing across Brisbane's northern suburbs, with 220 homes in construction or under contract, as the government progresses towards its target of 53,500 social and community homes by 2044.

Youth Foyer in Chermside

Delivering a new youth foyer in Chermside which will provide 40 self-contained units with 24/7 onsite support for 16 to 25 year olds who are experiencing or are at risk of homelessness and taking part in study, training or work. Delivered in partnership with the Federal Government Housing Australia Future Fund.

Supporting grassroots sport

Investing in upgrades at local clubs including the Aspley Hornets, Brothers Rugby Club, Everton Park Junior Rugby Union Club, Valleys Football Club, Brothers Junior RLFC, Grange Thistle Football Club, Sandgate Hawks AFC, Mitchelton Football Club, North Brisbane Rugby Club, North Star Football Club and Wilston-Grange AFC. Part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Gympie Road and Beams Road intersection upgrade

Progressing the upgrade of the Gympie Road and Beams Road intersection in Carseldine to accommodate increasing traffic volumes and improve connectivity for commuters and pedestrians. Part of the Safer Roads, Better Transport Initiative.

Beams Road rail level crossing project

Delivering upgrades to the rail level crossing on Beams Road. Delivered in partnership with the Federal Government and the Brisbane City Council.

Suncorp Stadium upgrades

Delivering upgrades at Suncorp Stadium to improve the fan experience, with greater capacity, wraparound screens, and new entertainment zones, cementing the Cauldron's place as the best rectangular stadium in the Southern Hemisphere for decades to come.

Albany Creek Road and Gayford Street intersection upgrade

Upgrading the intersection on Albany Creek Sub-Arterial Road (Albany Creek Road and Maundrell Terrace) and Gayford Street (Aspley).

Clayfield intersection upgrade

Delivering an upgraded intersection at Junction Road, Morrison Road and Park Avenue, Clayfield. Part of the Targeted Road Safety Program.

Gateway Motorway, Bracken Ridge to Pine River upgrade

Delivering upgrades to the Gateway Motorway between Bracken Ridge and Pine River. In partnership with the Federal Government.

Linkfield Road Overpass upgrade

Investing in upgrading the Linkfield Road Overpass to double capacity and accommodate high-clearance freight vehicles. Delivered in partnership with the Federal Government and the Brisbane City Council.

Stafford Road and South Pine Road intersection upgrade

Investing in a major upgrade of the Stafford Road-South Pine Road intersection in Everton Park to improve safety and reduce peak-hour congestion. Part of the Safer Roads, Better Transport Initiative.

Prince Charles Hospital expansion

Expanding the Prince Charles Hospital with at least 93 new overnight beds as part of the Hospital Rescue Plan, and expanding the hospital's transit lounge to deliver 24 treatment spaces, improve patient flow and upgrade clinical infrastructure.

Better Services through a Stronger Economy



Protection of koala habitats in South East Queensland

Supporting koala habitat revegetation and landscape connectivity enhancement projects through the Grassroots Environmental Grants Koala Habitat Restoration program.

Frontline housing and homelessness services

Delivering housing and homelessness services to vulnerable Queenslanders across Brisbane's northern suburbs to assist them to secure longer-term housing and access other specialist support services including temporary accommodation, outreach and connection to broader community services.

Bald Hills Memorial Hall

Supporting the upgrade of Bald Hills Memorial Hall amenities block to improve accessibility.

Freezing South East Queensland bulk water prices

Easing cost pressures on South East Queensland households by freezing bulk water prices for two years, saving families around \$130.

Skilling Queenslanders for Work

Delivering employment and training programs in Brisbane North to assist unemployed and underemployed Queenslanders into work (part of the annual \$80 million Skilling Queenslanders for Work investment).

New Medical Imaging Service in Brighton

Delivering a new MRI machine, CT scanner, X-ray and ultrasound services to the Brighton Health Campus, providing easier access to vital diagnostic imaging services closer to home.

Supercharged Solar for Renters

Driving down renters' power bills for more than 6,500 households with solar rebates, saving around \$700 a year. Eligible landlords can receive a rebate of up to \$3,500 to install solar on rental properties.

Advanced Robotics Manufacturing Hub

Supporting industry capability through the integration of robotics, artificial intelligence and other Industry 4.0 technologies into their manufacturing operations at the Northgate ARM Hub.

Digital Hospital Program

Delivering the rollout of ieMR at The Prince Charles Hospital and the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital, establishing Metro North Health as a fully digital health service.

Zero Litter to the Bay by 2030

Progressing partnerships with local government to upgrade stormwater network infrastructure by installing at least 100 filtration devices to prevent plastics and litter larger than 5mm escaping into Moreton Bay by 2030 (\$35 million over five years).

\$150 Back to School Boost

Better relief you can rely on with a 50% increase to the Back to School Boost, with \$150 for every primary school student.

Healthy Kindy Kids

Expanding the Healthy Kindy Kids program statewide, with free vision, hearing and speech development checks for children in kindergarten, giving them the best chance to be ready for school.

Queensland Fuel Security Plan

Fast-tracking the Taroom Trough Development Plan and investing in new refining and storage capability on Queensland soil.
