Centenary Bridge Upgrade

Delivering the Centenary Bridge duplication to get Western Brisbane residents home sooner. Delivered in partnership with the Federal Government.

Centenary Motorway

Delivering planning for future improvements to the Centenary Motorway between the Centenary Bridge and Fig Tree Pocket.

Jamboree Heights State School

Delivering six new classrooms to replace hire buildings and older modular buildings.

Kenmore District Junior Australian Football Club

Investing in funding and support for the Kenmore Bears Junior Australian Football Club. Part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

Kenmore State High School

Delivering an outdoor learning area through co-contribution to the school.

Middle Park State School

Delivering a new two-storey building, featuring a music and ensemble room, a STEM/Science Flexible Learning Area, five general learning areas, and outdoor learning spaces.

Moggill Junior Australian Football Club

Investing in design and construction of a four-post pavilion (on slab) and providing a fit-for-purpose room for club umpires.

Kenmore Roundabout

Investing to improve safety and congestion at the Kenmore roundabout and at the Our Lady of the Rosary intersection. Part of the Safer Roads, Better Transport initiative.

Mount Crosby Bowls Club

Investing in the Mount Crosby Bowls Club to deliver infrastructure improvements and capital upgrades.

Queensland Academy for Science Mathematics and Technology

Delivering changerooms and replacing amenities.

Toowong State School

Delivering new classrooms at Toowong State School, supporting local schooling capacity in the inner-west.

Funding for local pony clubs

Investing in club infrastructure and equipment upgrades at the Moggill Pony Club, Brookfield Horse and Pony Club, Karana Downs Pony Club and Yarawa Pony Club Community. Part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

University of Queensland Football Club

Investing in funding and support to upgrade dugouts and goal posts to support football at Kenmore.

Upgrade of Minnie Street, Upper Kedron

Upgrading Minnie Street, Upper Kedron, to improve safety, capacity and pedestrian, cyclist and traffic access (\$3.9 million). Part of the South East Queensland Community Stimulus Program.

Mount Crosby East Substation

Supporting the replacement of Mount Crosby Substation to improve network performance.

Freezing South East Queensland bulk water prices

Easing cost pressures on South East Queensland households by freezing bulk water prices for two years, saving families around \$130.

Frontline housing and homelessness services

Delivering housing and homelessness services to vulnerable Queenslanders across Brisbane's western suburbs to assist them to secure longer-term housing and access other specialist support services, including temporary accommodation, outreach and connection to broader community services.

Moggill Community and Neighbourhood Centre

Supporting a dedicated community and neighbourhood centre for Moggill.

Protection of koala habitats in South East Queensland

Supporting koala habitat revegetation and landscape connectivity enhancement projects through the Grassroots Environmental Grants Koala Habitat Restoration program.

Delivering local conservation projects

Supporting local catchment groups to deliver projects to restore creeks and land, and monitor wildlife to enhance habitat at various locations across Brisbane's west.

Digital Hospital Program

Delivering the rollout of ieMR at The Prince Charles Hospital and the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital, establishing Metro North Health as a fully digital health service.

Zero Litter to the Bay by 2030

Progressing partnerships with local government to upgrade stormwater network infrastructure by installing at least 100 filtration devices to prevent plastics and litter larger than 5mm escaping into Moreton Bay by 2030 (\$35 million over five years).

Skilling Queenslanders for Work

Delivering employment and training programs in the Brisbane West to assist unemployed and underemployed Queenslanders into work (part of the annual \$80 million Skilling Queenslanders for Work investment).

Supercharged Solar for Renters

Driving down renters' power bills for more than 6,500 households with solar rebates, saving around \$700 a year. Eligible landlords can receive a rebate of up to \$3,500 to install solar on rental properties.

\$150 Back to School Boost

Better relief you can rely on with a 50% increase to the Back to School Boost, with \$150 for every primary school student.

Healthy Kindy Kids

Expanding the Healthy Kindy Kids program statewide, with free vision, hearing and speech development checks for children in kindergarten, giving them the best chance to be ready for school.

Queensland Fuel Security Plan

Fast-tracking the Taroom Trough Development Plan and investing in new refining and storage capability on Queensland soil.
