## Making Queensland Safer



### **Anti-motor vehicle theft in Capalaba**

Investing \$600,000 in anti-motor vehicle theft measures in Capalaba.

### **Delivering an Anti-Hooning Camera Network**

Reducing dangerous and illegal hooning activities in Rochedale South, Springwood, Daisy Hill, Shailer Park, Mount Cotton, Sheldon and Priestdale to deliver a safer and more secure community (\$2 million over three years).

### **Queensland Fire and Rescue Trucks**

Delivering new and replacement fire and rescue trucks to provide firefighters with the equipment needed to help protect the community (\$22.9 million in 2026-27).

### **Disaster Event System Replacement**

Delivering a replacement Disaster Event Management System to support more effective critical decision-making and responses during disaster events (\$6.1 million over two years).

### **Keeping our kids safe**

Boosting the safety of children in childcare, schools and the community with \$450 million to progress recommendations from the Child Safety Commission of Inquiry, as well as establish a new Queensland Protection Commission and a first-of-its-kind Intelligence Hub.

### **More police on the frontline**

Recruiting more police to grow our frontline to restore safety where you live.

### **Circuit Breaker Sentencing**

Delivering new court-ordered remote rehabilitation-focused detention for youth offenders to break the cycle of crime and make Queensland safer.

### **Proven Initiatives early intervention programs**

Delivering community-led, results-driven early intervention programs with a proven track record of success, to turn youth away from crime and make Queensland safer.

### **Staying on Track**

Reducing repeat crime with intensive 12-month rehabilitation programs after detention to keep youth on the right path.

### **Domestic and Family Violence Electronic Monitoring**

Helping protect victims of domestic and family violence with an electronic monitoring pilot program for high-risk domestic and family violence offenders.

### **Fixing the DNA Debacle**

Continuing to deliver faster justice for victims by clearing the backlog at the DNA Lab and bolstering Director of Public Prosecutions resources to get cases to court quicker.





### **More social and community housing**

Expanding and improving social and community housing in Redlands, with 76 homes in construction or under contract, as the government progresses towards its target of 53,500 social and community homes by 2044.

### **Redlands Cricket Club**

Investing in Redlands Cricket Club to deliver new women's changeroom and bathroom block at the club's playing fields at EGW Wood Sportsground. Part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

### **Wellington Point Bowls Club**

Investing in the Wellington Point Bowls Club to install shade and synthetic surfaces. Part of the *Games On!* Grassroots Infrastructure Program.

### **South West Victoria Point Gravity Sewer Infrastructure Expansion**

Constructing a new sewer pump station and rising main, installing a gravity main, integrating with the existing system to support residential development in Victoria Point. Part of the Residential Activation Fund.

### **Alexandra Hills TAFE upgrades**

Constructing a new Electrotechnology Training Centre and delivering infrastructure renewal works at Alexandra Hills TAFE.

### **Southern Moreton Bay Islands Marine Centre of Excellence**

Delivering a Marine Centre of Excellence in Southern Moreton Bay Islands in partnership with industry and TAFE Queensland.

### **Capalaba intersection safety upgrades**

Delivering an upgraded intersection at Birkdale Road (Moreton Bay Road) and Capalaba Central Shopping Centre. Part of the Targeted Road Safety Program.

### **Dunwich pedestrian safety upgrade**

Investing in improving pedestrian safety at the intersection of East Coast Road (Junner Street and Ballow Road) and Cunningham Street (Dunwich).

### **Mount Cotton Road and Valley Way intersection upgrade**

Investing to upgrade the intersection on Mount Cotton Road and Valley Way. Part of the Safer Roads, Better Transport Initiative.

### **Weinam Creek Car Park**

Delivering a car park within the Weinam Creek Priority Development Area.

### **Redland Whitewater Centre**

Delivering a whitewater facility to support recreational activities, adventure sport participation and delivery of the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games. Part of the \$7.1 billion Games Venues Program jointly funded by the Queensland and Federal Governments.



## Better Services through a Stronger Economy



### Zero Litter to the Bay by 2030

Progressing partnerships with local government to upgrade stormwater network infrastructure by installing at least 100 filtration devices to prevent plastics and litter larger than 5mm escaping into Moreton Bay by 2030 (\$35 million over five years).

### New RSPCA Wildlife Hospital at Capalaba

Delivering the new RSPCA Wildlife Hospital at Redlands IndigiScapes Centre Precinct in Capalaba (\$12 million over four years).

### Frontline housing and homelessness services

Delivering housing and homelessness services to vulnerable Queenslanders in Redlands to assist them to secure longer-term housing and access other specialist support services including temporary accommodation, outreach and connection to broader community services.

### Freezing South East Queensland bulk water prices

Easing cost pressures on South East Queensland households by freezing bulk water prices for two years, saving families around \$130.

### Boost to Buy

Delivering the Boost to Buy home ownership scheme, supporting up to 2,000 first home buyers.

### Redland Hospital MRI machine

Delivering a new MRI machine to the Redland Hospital, providing easier access to vital diagnostic imaging services closer to home.

### Supercharged Solar for Renters

Driving down renters' power bills for more than 6,500 households with solar rebates, saving around \$700 a year. Eligible landlords can receive a rebate of up to \$3,500 to install solar on rental properties.

### Protection of koala habitats in South East Queensland

Supporting koala habitat revegetation and landscape connectivity enhancement projects through the Grassroots Environmental Grants Koala Habitat Restoration program.

### \$150 Back to School Boost

Better relief you can rely on with a 50% increase to the Back to School Boost, with \$150 for every primary school student.

### Healthy Kindy Kids

Expanding the Healthy Kindy Kids program statewide, with free vision, hearing and speech development checks for children in kindergarten, giving them the best chance to be ready for school.

### Queensland Fuel Security Plan

Fast-tracking the Taroom Trough Development Plan and investing in new refining and storage capability on Queensland soil.
